

# How To

## Make a Peg Bag

### Equipment Needed

- \* A toddlers shirt/t-shirt with buttons down the front or just at the top
- \* A coat hanger, an adult's one is best as it makes the arms stand out.
- \* Thread to match the colour of shirt fabric
- \* Korbond 10" Dressmaking Scissors
- \* Korbond Pom Pom Maker and Wool (optional)

### Step One

Turn your shirt inside out and sew along the bottom of the shirt, by hand or machine (if the shirt is long take up the bottom to a reasonable length or it will be too long to reach the pegs)

### Step Two

If using a shirt, stitch up the gaps between the buttons keeping the top three buttons open, leaving enough space to get your hand in to retrieve the pegs.

### Step Three

Turn the right way and put the coat hanger inside, via the arms, (you may have to cut off the ends of the coat hanger if they are too long) as if hanging up the shirt. Fill with pegs.

### Step Four

If you prefer you can sew up the sleeves but they don't usually need to be, if you keep them open it is easier to get the coat hanger out when you need to wash the peg bag.

### Step Five

If the shirt is plain, you may want to decorate the front with some embroidery or buttons, or re-sew the original buttons with different colour thread to make them stand out more or decorate with pom-poms along the bottom, you can even purchase a pom-pom maker from Korbond.
